The Royals' mascot, Marty the Marmot, was onsite at Victoria General Hospital today to promote ticket sales for the big game. He was joined by Victoria Royals Senior VP of Sales & Marketing, Darren Parker, Victoria Hospitals Foundation Executive Director, Melanie Mahlman and Dr. Christine Hall of Island Health.

"We're excited to join forces with the Victoria Hospitals Foundation to raise money for equipment for the Emergency Department. Giving back to the community is an important priority for the Royals and we're proud to team up with an organization that makes such a difference in our hospitals," said Parker.

Dr. Christine Hall gave a demo of the vital signs monitors and talked about the importance of the Emergency Department. "Last year, this Emergency Department cared for 51,000 people, including more than 11,500 children under 17. In addition, Victoria General Hospital is the adult and pediatric trauma centre for Vancouver Island. We're thrilled that the Royals want to help out in this way and improve care on Vancouver Island."

Every year the Victoria Hospitals Foundation partners with groups and businesses in Victoria to organize a variety of fundraising events in support of Royal Jubilee and Victoria General. Gord Macatee is the Board Chair of the Victoria Hospitals Foundation. "Everyone benefits when we have access to high-quality healthcare," said Macatee.
