Emerge Stronger was launched in 2021 to support our local hospitals as they navigated the aftermath of the pandemic, and was completed in May 2023. The campaign spanned 18 months, including the entire 2022-23 fiscal year.

In just a year and a half, you joined over 5,800 donors to help fund more than 200 pieces of priority equipment, innovative research, education, and special projects. Together, you helped our hospitals adapt to evolving changes, supported our talented care teams, enabled more patients to access specialized care close to home, and fueled our researchers as they innovated towards a brighter, healthier future.

Today, thanks to you, a patient like Toni is undergoing sight-saving retinal laser surgery with more comfort and efficiency because of the new Retinal Laser you helped fund. Someone like Murray is undergoing neurosurgery on Vancouver Island and can recover close to their home and loved ones, rather than receiving care on the Mainland. And, someone like Dr. Kelly can continue to provide the best possible care.

Every week, Dr. Erasmus and his colleagues perform 20-25 laser treatments on Vancouver Island patients. Donors to the Emerge Stronger campaign helped fund a new

Retinal Laser. This state-of-the-art machine not only improves patient comfort and efficiency, it allows the team to have a back-up, ensuring thousands of Islanders can get the treatment they need, when they need it.

The Return of In-Person Events

Visions Gala: 30th Anniversary

The 30th anniversary of our signature gala was a night to celebrate and elevate our hospitals. **You raised \$1.58 million** that evening to help fund a new **Automated Chemistry Line**—an innovative piece of equipment that is now in the process of being operationalized at Royal Jubilee Hospital through staff training and calibration. At the time that this report is being written, our care teams are eagerly awaiting the complete replacement of this equipment.

The existing Chemistry Line at Royal Jubilee Hospital is over 20 years old, and is the most-used piece of equipment within Island Health. It is responsible for testing patient samples. Nearly every patient who is admitted to our hospitals relies on this equipment.

The current Chemistry Line can perform **1,000 tests per day,** whereas the new Automated Chemistry Line can perform **over 1,200 tests per hour.** It allows for an increased capacity of 400%, and can report on samples 40% faster for our most critical patients.

Miracle on the Mountain Gala: Inaugural Event

In May 2022, you united on the West Shore and raised **\$430,000** to help purchase an **O-Arm imaging system** for Victoria General Hospital—the same one used on Murray—and other priority needs identified through *Emerge Stronger*.

An O-Arm provides precise, real-time imaging for surgeons operating on patients undergoing spinal, cranial, or neurological trauma-related surgery.



The O-Arm imaging system benefits up to 50 neurosurgery patients every month from across Vancouver Island.

Honouring Your Caring Spirits

Whether you have a life-saving operation or just a few stitches, a caregiver's kindness and care make all the difference. The *Caring Spirit* program gives patients and family members the opportunity to recognize a healthcare worker (or hospital unit) who went the extra mile and make a donation in their name towards priority medical equipment.

In 2022-23, **112** *Caring Spirit* gifts were made to celebrate our hospital teams, with donations totalling over \$102,000. These gifts recognized 123 individuals and 39 units.

Through donor support, our hospitals are strengthened in every area of care, benefitting all types of patients. Below is the story of just one of the many patients donors impact.

On June 28, 2022, I was working in Victoria, operating on the Tactical Unit for the Greater Victoria Emergency Response Team, when I responded to a bank robbery and hostage-taking incident here in Saanich.

When I arrived at the scene, two armed suspects confronted my fellow police officers and me with semi-automatic rifles, and a gun battle ensued. I was struck by two bullets—one striking and shattering my upper femur, while another ripped through my abdomen. I immediately thought of my two kids, Eli and Ella, who are ten and eight years old. I couldn't believe I had been shot. I didn't know if I was going to survive, and I worried about what would happen to my kids if I didn't.

I was stabilized for transport to Victoria General Hospital, where I spent a week and a half in a medically-induced coma while surgeons worked to save my life. I required vascular reconstruction and a metal rod inserted into my femur for stabilization. I also had a partial gastrectomy in which part of my stomach was removed as a result of the bullet that tore through my stomach and liver. When I woke up, I immediately thought of my kids. I just wanted to see them.

I spent the next eight weeks in the trauma unit at VGH, recovering and receiving a high level of care. I was in the hospital for 71 days. I really can't speak highly enough of my care team. They were all so invested in my recovery and encouraged me through every challenge. I am so thankful for the amazing care I received by my heroes at the hospital that worked so many hours to save my life and provide such incredible care towards my recovery.

Today, my life involves full-time rehab with physio, RMT, and chiropractor as I work toward my goal of getting strong and fit to return to living life to its fullest—and to return to active duty with the Greater Victoria Emergency Response Team.

Before this incident, I had no idea the Victoria Hospitals Foundation existed. As I look back on what happened more than a year ago, I take a moment to acknowledge the excellent care teams we have in Victoria—and you, the donors who support them. This community means so much to me, now more than ever.

Your Impact



Equipment

In 2022-23, you helped us disburse over \$7.6 million (70.3% of total disbursements to Island Health) to fund priority capital equipment. You created change by funding **312 pieces of equipment** such as:



10 new beds added to the Coronary Care Unit (CCU) at RJH.

YOUR IMPACT: More comfort and safety for the 700+ Island patients treated in the CCU every year.



30 patient beds, two specialized bariatric beds, and seven patient lifts at Gorge Road Hospital.

YOUR IMPACT: Increased capacity and safety, faster admission times, and enhanced specialized care.



A jet ventilator, a first for Vancouver Island.

YOUR IMPACT: More children can stay on the Island to receive care with this new specialized ventilator. About 200 NICU patients will use this equipment annually.



Two pediatric cardiology ultrasounds for VGH.

YOUR IMPACT: Better support for the Pediatric Cardiology Clinic, which performs 1,800 ultrasounds annually, and sees over 2,000 clinic visits for Island children.

Five new cystoscopes for RJH.

YOUR IMPACT: Better and more efficient care for the Cystoscopy Clinic, which performs over 5,000 procedures annually. This clinic sees over 125 patients per week. Additional scopes allow the clinic to see at least 30 more patients per week, helping to reduce waitlist times by up to four weeks.

YOUR IMPACT

You supported the funding of equipment that helped administer over 3.14 million scans, tests, and procedures.

Your Impact



Research

In 2022-23, you helped us disburse over \$931,000 (8.5% of total disbursements to Island Health) to fund 15 research projects supporting 19 researchers. Examples include:



Celebrating its seventh year, the **Neil and Susan Manning Cognitive Health Initiative** has taken ground-breaking strides to improve regional dementia care.

YOUR IMPACT: Bringing patients and families tailored treatment plans and improved outcomes by reducing referral times to specialist care, adopting new diagnostic tools, and increasing access to clinical trials and research studies.

The **Code Hack**, hosted by Island Health's Innovation Lab was partly funded by you!

YOUR IMPACT: 100 participants were tasked with coming up with creative solutions to healthcare challenges in 24 hours. The winning idea: an innovative bedside commode that improves accessibility, mobility, and dignity for patients.

We hosted **Health xChange**, in partnership with Michael Smith Health Research of BC and Island Health.

YOUR IMPACT: You supported researchers, research user partners, health system decision-makers, and community members as they shared ideas and presentations focused on innovative healthcare research projects.

Five **catalysts grants** were awarded to 10 researchers as part of the *Innovation* phase of *Emerge Stronger*.

YOUR IMPACT: You fuelled transformational projects, including:

Cryoneurolysis for Spasticity

Spasticity (muscle stiffness) is usually caused by damage to nerve pathways within the brain or spinal cord, affecting hundreds of thousands of Canadians with neurological disorders including stroke, cerebral palsy, brain injury, and multiple sclerosis.

Award-winning local physician and researcher Dr. Paul Winston has developed an inexpensive way to relieve pain for spasticity patients while dramatically improving limb movement. The novel treatment is called cryoneurotomy, and it's the first of its kind.

Accelerating Treatment for Pneumonia Patients

Dr. Michael Chen and Dr. David Goodlett are developing a way to speed up the time it takes to identify respiratory pathogens (bacteria or fungi) in pneumonia patients from the current 72 hours to just one hour.

This project has the potential to accelerate treatment for critically ill patients, improve survival rates for those in urgent situations, reduce length of hospital stays, and fast-track treatment plans.

Special Projects



In 2022-23, you helped us disburse over \$2 million for special projects (18.8% of total disbursements to Island Health). Your philanthropy has benefited many strategic investments, like capital projects that expanded space and resources for Island patients.

You helped expand critical care resources, enable social opportunities for critical patients with similar care journeys, fund educational videos, and create a therapeutic space for the Mental Health Sub-Acute Unit.

Education



In 2022-23, you helped us disburse over \$163,000 (1.5% of total disbursements to Island Health) to fund educational opportunities for care workers. Your support leads to better patient care, stronger collaboration amongst our care teams, and leading-edge approaches to diagnosis and treatment.
