APRIL 1, 2025 to MARCH 31, 2026

RULES OF PLAY

- All Island Health staff are eligible to play.
- Participants must be 19 years of age or over. If the winning ticket bears a minor's name, the prize will be lawfully delivered on behalf of the minor to the minor's parent, legal guardian or trustee.
- This is a bi-weekly payroll deduction raffle with one winning ticket drawn and one winner receiving 50% of the total money for that draw.
- Tickets may be sold and purchased only in British Columbia. If you live outside of British Columbia you are not eligible to participate.
- Draw dates and location are every 4th Friday at 11:30am (except on statutory holidays or office closures at which time the payday is the draw date) beginning April 17, 2025 and ending March 20, 2026 at KPMG Chartered Professional Accountants, St. Andrews Square, 800-730 View St. Victoria BC V8W 3Y7.
- If for some reason, the draw cannot take place on the draw date listed, a substitute draw date and time will be selected. All ticket purchasers will be able to see the amended draw date and time information posted on the same website the ticket was purchased.
- Each pay period, Island Health provides the Victoria Hospitals Foundation with a list of payroll deduction lotto participants. Only these participants will be eligible for that draw.
- If you are not paid in the pay period you will not play in that pay period's draw.
- Once your application is received by the Victoria Hospitals Foundation and your employee payroll record has been updated by Island Health, an email notification will be sent to you from the Foundation confirming your enrollment in the Payday Lotto. Because of cut-off dates for Island Health pay periods, it may take several weeks before payroll deductions begin.
- The Victoria Hospitals Foundation is required to publish the winning player's name and the amount won. Each payday, after notifying the winner, the winning name is emailed to all lotto participants and posted on our website at www.victoriahf.ca/payday-lotto/.
- Players are notified of updates, changes, or renewals to Payday Lotto via email. You are responsible for keeping your contact information up-to-date in Island Health's Employee Self Service as this is where we retrieve your information to contact you if you win.
- Winners are required to present their valid Island Health identification or pay stub for the winning period along with one other piece of photo identification to receive their cheque from the Victoria Hospitals Foundation.
- Participants will be entered for eligible draws through the period of April 1, 2025 – March 31, 2026. Requests to leave the lotto are at the discretion of the employee. Please note that employee payroll records are updated in Island Health's system on the Friday following a payday so it may take up to two weeks for your request to leave the lotto to be fully processed.
- Please note that the annual cost of lotto participation is not considered a charitable donation by the Canada Revenue Agency and is therefore not eligible for a tax receipt.
- The Victoria Hospitals Foundation is committed to protecting your privacy. Information provided is for internal use only. We will not sell, trade or rent your personal information nor add you to any solicitation list.
- Staff at all of the Hospitals Foundation that support Island Health are not eligible to play Payday Lotto.
- Victoria Hospitals Foundation Board Members are not eligible to play Payday Lotto.
- Should there be a cancellation of the draw, the licensee will contact Gaming Policy and Enforcement Branch to determine whether refunds are required.
